

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY CONTRACT PROCEDURES FOR THE 2022 CULVERT REPAIR PROJECT

WHEREAS, portions of the Borough of Watchung experienced severe flooding during Tropical Storm Ida ("Storm"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer has inspected the culvert damage sustained during the Storm and advised that the Storm caused extreme flooding on the East Branch and West Branch of the Stony Brook that caused damage to the culverts located at Glen Eagle Drive, Hill Hollow Road, Sherwood Drive and Brook Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer also advised that there are severely damaged headwalls and utilities (gas, electric, cable, water and telephone) within the right-of-way, the pavement is missing and advanced erosion, resulting in a fifteen (15) feet deep open exposure; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer has recommended to the Borough's Purchasing Agent and the Mayor and Council an emergency declaration and authorization to proceed with an emergent contract for the repairs to outverts and drainage facilities as set forth above and the need for the performance of a contract and delivery of goods and services and the need to invoke N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that due to severe flooding and the damage the Storm caused to the above stated culverts and the specific conditions expressed by the Borough Engineer, the Council of the Borough of Watchung, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey hereby declares an emergency and authorizes the use of the emergency contract procedures of N.J.S.A. 404:11-6 for the repair of these Culverts and other drainage facilities; and

BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that it hereby authorizes the Borough Administrator, Chief Financial Officer/Purchasing Agent, Borough Clerk, Remington & Vernick Engineering and legal counsel to take all action necessary to procure an emergency contract for the repair and replacement of these facilities in an expeditious fashion.
