





## CHECKLIST FOR CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

- The "Insured" must read the same on ALL forms.
- The Insurance Company must be listed under "Insurer Affording Coverage"
- Type of insurance must be "Commercial or Business Liability"
- The policy number and effective and expiration dates must be listed
- The event or program must fall within the effective and expiration dates
- The minimum limit of liability is \$1,000,000 listed next to "Each Occurrence"
- Under "Description of Operations" The Borough of Watchung should be listed as additionally insured with respect to the event or program and the date(s) The event or program and dates must also be listed.
- The "Certificate Holder" should show "The Borough of Watchung, 15 Mountain Blvd., Watchung, NJ 07069

## Watchung Recreation Commission Facility/Field Use Policies and Lease Agreement

#### General Information

To rent a facility or field, community organizations are required to complete a rental application and pay the appropriate fee (if applicable). No "Sub-leasing" of any kind from one sports group to another is permitted. All dates, times and fields must be approved.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to consider all rental requests and allocate rental time based on the number of requests and overall time requested. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to disapprove permits if it is determined that fields are deteriorating because of overuse.

Community members must be 21 years of age to sign a Field Use agreement or rent a field or facility. All applicants are required to provide one adult chaperone for each group of 10 youth in attendance under the age of 21 for all planned activities.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to require the renter to provide police security for special programs.

All fees are to be paid in full two weeks prior to an approval unless other arrangements have been made with the Recreation Coordinator.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to cancel practices/games due to weather conditions and/or field conditions. Failure to abide by this policy can result in cancellation of your rental agreement.

#### Renter Responsibilities

All applicants requesting use of Watchung fields or facilities must observe the following guidelines and requirements:

- 1. The renter must leave the area, facility or equipment in a clean and enderly condition. All trash must be properly disposed.
- 2. Prohibited Items: Beer, wine, alcoholic beverages, firearms, tobacco and illegal drugs.
- 3. Liability: The Watchung Recreation Commission and the Borough of Watchung assume no liability for the renter's use of the equipment, field or facility. The applicant shall hold the Borough hamless from any claim or liability arising out of any activity or conduct of the renter while using the equipment, field or facility in question. Applicants are required to supply general liability insurance that covers the Borough with timits of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit with an aggregate of \$2,000,000.00. A certificate of insurance, must be filed with the Borough at least five days prior to the use of the Boroughs field or facility.
- 4. Governmental Boards and Agencies: facilities are evailable at no charge to official government boards and agencies for events in the public interest when not otherwise in conflict with this policy.
- 5. Damages: Any and all damages to the facilities, equipment, and other Borough property, while being used by the renter, will be the responsibility of the renter and payable in full to the Borough of Watchung. Payment will include the costs of all labor, materials, and supplies to repair or replace the damage to facilities. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to decline renting to patrons who have incurred damages to Borough property in previous rentals.
- 6. Policy of Non-Discrimination: The Borough of Watchung facilities are available on a non-discriminatory basis. Appropriate activities need to accommodate individuals regardless of age, sex, race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disabilities, or marital status. The Borough of Watchung does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission, access, treatment or employment in its programs or activities.
- 7. ADA Statement: Although specific programs for persons with disabilities are limited, the Watchung Recreation Commission is committed to providing equal access to programs and facilities for these individuals. Reasonable accommodation and support can be requested to provide access to desired programs and activities. Requests should be made at least 10 days in advance. In addition, where a need is demonstrated and resources are available every reasonable effort will be made to establish specific programs for persons with disabilities.

The individual signing this lease agreement is responsible for ensuring that all policies included in this agreement are followed. The representative should notify us immediately if there are any maintenance or safety issues or damage to the fields that need to be addressed. In order to participate in, organize, assist, enjoy, supervise or in any other way further the activity I will be holding (as described above) on the date(s) listed above.

5. I state that the activity listed above will not include the consumption of alcoholic beverages, but should any person described in Paragraph 4 consume alcohol or allow or permit others to consume alcohol then I agree to be bound by the terms of paragraph 6 below.

6. I state that the activity listed above will include the consumption of alcoholic beverages and that because of such consumption i have the following additional duties to perform for You related to the use of the site listed above;

(a) that I am solely responsible for the dispensing and consuming of alcohol, including the prudent and responsible dispensing and consuming of alcohol by all persons involved in the activity described above, including but not limited to those persons described in paragraph 4 above; (b) to acknowledge by the signing of this Hold-Harmless that You have no authority, control, or participation in the dispensing or consuming of alcohol on the site and date listed above and that I will take no step(s), action(s), or measure(s) to convey the idea that You in any way have promoted, assisted, or participated in the dispensing and consuming of alcoholic beverages on the site and date listed above; (c) that I will not allow persons under the age of 21 to dispense or consume alcohol at the site during the activity to be held on Your property;(d) to comply with all municipal Ordinances relating to the consumption of alcoholic beverages, including but not limited to obtaining any necessary permits.

## 2020 ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY, INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS FOR THE USE OF BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG FIELDS, PARKS AND FACILITIES (APPLICANT)

#### I. Background and Purpose

The Borough of Watchung and the Borough of Watchung Recreation Commission (hereinafter jointly and separately referred to as the "Borough of Watchung") offer(s) Facility, Park and Field Use to the public for a variety of indoor and outdoor physical, social and educational programs and activities, including but not limited to competitive and non-competitive sports and sporting events, organized leagues, day camps, games, and instructional/training programs and camps (collectively referred to hereinafter as the "FACILITY AND FIELD USE"). The Borough of Watchung fields, facilities, parks and property and other public and semi-public places may be accessible to large numbers of people on a daily basis.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and until further notice, any Organization, Company, and or individual(s) seeking to rent a Borough of Watchung facility or field for an event, program, or planned activity ("PROGRAM") shall require any adult, age 18 or older wishing to enroll themselves, their child(ren) or any other dependent(s) family members into or participate in the PROGRAM, or seeking to otherwise voluntarily participate or attend the PROGRAM as a coach, counselor, instructor, referee, official, or volunteer, to complete, sign an Acknowledgement and Waiver of Liability. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Applicant for the use of the Borough Field, Park and/or Facility to obtain and maintain a copy of the Acknowledgement and Waiver of Liability for a period of at least two (2) years from the date of the scheduled event.

Permission to access any Borough of Watchung facilities/property and equipment is expressly conditional on the Organization, Company and/or Individual(s) seeking to use or rent a Borough Field or Facility obtaining from all of its participants and attendees a properly completed and signed Acknowledgement and Waiver of Liability in a timely manner. The Organization, Company and/or Individual shall not permit an individual's participation or attendance in the PROGRAM without an executed Acknowledgement and Waiver of Liability.

Access to any Borough of Watchung facility, field, park, property and/or equipment may be denied or revoked at any time for the failure of the Organization, Company and/or individual to have obtained a properly completed, signed Acknowledgement and Waiver of Liability from all of its participants and/or attendees.

I/WE have requested the use of a Borough of Watchung Field, Facility and/or Park for a PROGRAM and in consideration of the use of the Borough Field, Facility, and/or Park, I/WE, the undersigned agree to assume all risks of the Program and agree to indemnify and hold the Borough of Watchung and its officers, agents, and employees harmless from any and all liability, claims, costs, and attorney's fees arising out of the use of the Borough Property.

I/WE further acknowledge that operation and implementation of the PROGRAM may pose an inherent and heightened risk of exposure, infection and bodily injury from the Pandemic Illnesses regardless of preventative measures taken by the Borough of Watchung.

By signing this ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, WAIVER, INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS, I/WE on behalf of ourselves, the PROGRAM PARTICIPANT(S) and other members of their household, voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks, and do accept sole and complete responsibility for any and all injuries, damage(s) and other losses to the PROGRAM PARTICIPANT(S), and other members of their household for attending or participating in the PROGRAM, including for all bodily injuries, disabilities, permanent disabilities, deaths, illnesses, damages, losses, claims, demands, liabilities, medical treatment and expenses, attorneys' fees, costs of suit and/or expenses of any kind that is incurred in connection with attending or participating in any PROGRAM.

## **RESOLUTION OPPOSING A-1294/S-2103 AND URGING THAT SUCH LEGISLATION NOT ADVANCE FURTHER**

WHEREAS, local officials, because of their peculiar knowledge of local conditions, are in the best position to determine land use and zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, this peculiar knowledge is used to develop a Municipal Master Plan, which is adopted with the goal of promoting the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and only after careful and thoughtful consideration by local officials for its compatibility and consistency with other state, county and regional plans, such as the State Development and Redevelopment Plan, the Coastal Area Facility Review Act, the Highlands Water Protection and Planning Act, the Pinelands Protection Act, the County Solid Waste Management Plan and Water Quality Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Master Plan guides the determination to designate land use and zoning districts, which help effectuate the careful development plans and goals outlined within the Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Land Use Law lays out a comprehensive system allowing for and detailing the process in which applicants for development may seek to deviate from these careful and deliberate land use and zoning regulations through the municipal planning board's review of a variance; and

WHEREAS, consideration of a tand use variance is done by local officials, taking into account the variety of circumstances including the proposed deviation's impacts on the goals of the Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law provides municipalities with substantial tools to support the redevelopment of blighted sites, including the creation of site-specific redevelopment plans and numerous financial incentives; and

WHEREAS, legislation, A-1/294/S-2103, has been introduced that would preempt local control over land use and zoning regulations, allowing certain qualifying office park and retail center properties to be permitted, as of right, to redevelop as a mixed-use development, not requiring a use variance; and

WHEREAS, A-1294/S-2103 requires a planning board approve an application for development to convert and eligible property to a mixed-used development unless the application causes "substantial detriment to the public good" and "substantially impair[s] the intent and purposes of the zone plan and zoning ordinance", a vague standard that may be difficult if not impossible to overcome; and

WHEREAS, A-1294/S-2103 may interfere with municipalities implementing alternative visions for the redevelopment of office park and retail center properties, including as industrial sites, parkland, or sites for needed infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, A-1294/S-2103 would interfere with existing and potential Redevelopment Plans that were specifically developed to address office park and retail center properties; and

WHEREAS, A-1294/S-2103 does not take into account conditions such as flooding and future climate risk that may impact the suitability of a site for mixed-use development; and

WHEREAS, this top-down approach, eliminating local land use planning regulations undermines the recognized benefits of municipal land use regulation, without providing the appropriate review for deviation as outlined within the Municipal Land Use Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Borough of Watchung in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey opposes this legislation, and urges our representatives to not advance further A-1294/S-2103; and


#### SYNOPSIS

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Authorizes conversion of certain office parks and retail senters to mixed-use developments.

### CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee on May 9, 2022, with amendments.



(Sponsorship Updated As Of: 5/9/2022)

AN ACT concerning the conversion of certain office parks and retail centers to mixed-use developments and supplementing chapter 55D of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. The Legislature finds and declares:

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a. New Jersey is one of the most suburban states in the country.

b. The rapid, post-World War II development of New Jersey
was based upon an automobile-dependent economy and lifestyle,
and led to the proliferation of large regional shopping malls and
suburban office parks.

c. While, for decades, large regional shopping malls and
suburban office parks prospered, and enabled New Jersey to
prosper, these old single-use forms of development are now in such
significant decline throughout the State and the country that
academics and planners have termed them "stranded assets."

d. Rutgers University professors, James W. Hughes and Joseph
J. Seneca, in their 2015 publication "New Jersey's Rostsuburban
Economy," explain that just as New Jersey successfully evolved
from an urban manufacturing-based economy to a suburbanized
information-age, and research-driven economy, societal changes are
again challenging the State to reinvent itself.

e. As the post-war baby beem, suburban-centric workforce declines, and is replaced by a new generation comprised of echo boomers and millennials, the preferences of the new generation are causing corporations to leave regional shopping mails and suburban office parks behind, and to locate in places that are attractive for the new workforce

f. Millennials are driving these changes because there are so many of them. People between 20 and 36 years old outnumber every other generation in the country. Businesses want to hire them, sell to them, or both While in a former day, it was common for employees to relocate to secure employment, today it is more and more common for companies to relocate to areas in which millennials want to live, work, and play.

38 g. According to Professors Hughes and Seneca, the new 39 workforce does not find the car-culture suburbs in which they grew 40 up an attractive place to live, work and play. "Density, walkability, 41 public transit, work-life balance, and urban amenities have grown significantly as quality-of-life locational attractions. Suddenly, 42 43 New Jersey's greatest core advantage in the late twentieth century -44 a suburban-dominated, automobile-dependent economy and 45 lifestyle - is regarded as a disadvantage.

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in **bold-faced brackets** [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined thus is new matter.

Matter enclosed in superscript numerals has been adopted as follows: Senate SCU committee amendments adopted May 9, 2022. h. PlanSmart NJ's 2016 publication, "A Guide to the Future: Repurposing Stranded Assets and Revitalizing New Jersey's Suburbs," states that "technological advances and changing societal demands have eroded the suburbs' attractiveness to residents and corporations leaving behind large isolated and underutilized buildings, or 'stranded assets,' which no longer act as economic engines."

8 i. While the new workforce and employers alike want to locate
9 in livable walkable mixed-use communities, in which employees
10 can have a range of amenities within walking distance of work and
11 home, it is possible and desirable to repurpose stranded office parks
12 and shopping malls into mixed-use communities.

j. One significant impediment to repurposing stranded assets into mixed-use communities are outdated, rigid zoning regulations that often separate residential and commercial uses from each other.

k. According to the PlanSmart NJ report, "[z]oning ordinances
in suburban towns almost universally limit opportunities for mixed
use walkable designs because of the Euclidean template where uses
are rigorously separated. . . . In fact, single-use zoning ordinances
often 'unintentionally stand in the way of providing developers,
employers, and workers the types of modern spaces they desire,'
therefore, 'inhibiting a community's economic competitiveness.'"

I. In order to encourage developers to repurpose stranded
assets, it is appropriate for the Legislature to temporarily preempt
local use restrictions that stand in the way of attempts to redevelop
stranded single-use regional shopping centers and office parks into
vibrant, desirable, mixed-use communities.

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30 "Eligible property" means an office park of at least 50,000
31 square feet of a retail center of at least 15,000 square feet, which
32 office park or retail center has a vacance rate of at least 40 percent.

33 "Mixed-use development" means a development which includes
34 both a non-residential development component and a residential
35 development component

b. A mixed-use development shall be a permitted use and shall 36 37 not require a use variance pursuant to subsection d. of section 57 of 38 P.L.1975, c.291 (C.40:55D-70) if the mixed-use development is the 39 subject of an application for development to convert an eligible property to a mixed-use development, the application for 40 41 development is submitted for approval prior to the first day of the 42 25th month next following the effective date of P.L. 43 ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), and the c. (C. application for development complies with the following 44 45 requirements:

46 (1) the application proposes to develop at least two types of 47 uses;

48 (2) the application proposes to either:

2. a. As used in this section:

(a) reuse the existing building or buildings without expanding the square footage of the building or buildings on the eligible property, or

(b) redevelop the eligible property without expanding the square footage of the building or buildings on the eligible property; and

6 (3) if the application for development proposes new residential 7 units, at least 20 percent of the residential units constructed '[for 8 owner-occupancy and 15 percent of the residential units constructed 9 for rental occupancy  $\mathbf{I}^{t}$  shall be reserved as low income housing, 10 moderate income housing, or very low income housing, as those 11 terms are defined in section 4 of P.L.1985, c.222 (C.52:27D-304). 12 Of the units reserved as low income housing, moderate income 13 housing, or very low income housing, at least 50 percent within 14 each bedroom distribution shall be low income housing including at 15 least 13 percent within each bedroom distribution as very low income housing, and the units shall be otherwise in compliance with 16 17 the Uniform Housing Affordability Controls, adopted to implement

18 P.L.1985, c.222 (C.52:27D-301 et seq.).<sup>1</sup>

c. The planning board shall approve an application for
development to convert an eligible property to a mixed-use
development if the board determines that;

(1) the application can be granted (without causing substantial)
 detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the
 intent and purpose of the zone plan and zoning ordinance, and

(2) the application complies with the other requirements of thissection.

d. The planning board may condition approval of an application 27 28 for development to convert an eligible property to a mixed-use development upon complying with requirements for parking, water 29 30 supply, sanitary sewer capacity, storm water management, bulk standards, and all reasonable site plan review, recreation, and 31 design standards provided, however, that the height and setback 32 33 limitations applicable to a converted mixed-use development shall be the greatest height and least restrictive setback limitations 34 35 allowed within the zoning district under municipal ordinance or variance approved by the planning board. 36

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3. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### General Information

To rent a facility or field, community organizations are required to complete a rental application and pay the appropriate fee (if applicable). No "Sub-leasing" of any kind from one sports group to another is permitted. All dates, times and fields must be approved.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to consider all rental requests and allocate rental time based on the number of requests and overall time requested. The Recreation Commission reserves the right to disapprove permits if it is determined that fields are deteriorating because of overuse.

Community members must be 21 years of age to sign a Field Use agreement or rent a field or facility. All applicants are required to provide one adult chaperone for each group of 10 youth in attendance under the age of 21 for all planned activities.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to require the renter to provide police security for special programs.

All fees are to be paid in full two weeks prior to an approval unless other arrangements have been made with the Recreation Coordinator.

The Recreation Commission reserves the right to cancel practices/games due to weather conditions and/or field conditions. Failure to abide by this policy can result in cancellation of your rental agreement.

#### Renter Responsibilities

All applicants requesting use of Watchung fields or facilities must observe the following guidelines and requirements:

- 1. The renter must leave the area, facility or equipment in a clean and orderly condition. All trash must be properly disposed.
- 2. Prohibited Items: Beer, wine, alcoholic beverages, firearms, tobacco and Illegal drugs.
- 3. Liability: The Watchung Recreation Commission and the Borough of Watchung assume no ilability for the renter's use of the equipment, field or facility. The applicant shall hold the Borough hamless from any claim or ilability arising out of any activity or conduct of the renter while using the equipment, field or facility in question. Applicants are required to supply general liability insurance that covers the Borough with limits of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit with an aggregate of \$2,000,000.00. 


