ORDINANCE AMENDING APPENDIX A OF THE BOROUGH CODE TO UPDATE AND AMEND THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL, INCLUDING THE PROCEDURES FOR THE ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Watchung, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Appendix A entitled "Rules of Council, Ordinances" of the Code of the Borough of Watchung, is hereby supplemented and amended to read as follows: [New language

in bold and underlined; deleted language in double strikethrough]

Appendix A. Rules of the Council, Ordinances

- Part I. Rules of Order of the Mayor and Council
- Rule 1. Location and Time of Annual and Regular Meetings.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:45A-1, the date and time of the annual organization or reorganization meeting is scheduled for any day during the first week in January. The date of the annual organization or reorganization meeting shall be set by Resolution of the Mayor and Council during the prior December and notice of that meeting shall be given pursuant to applicable law.

Regular meetings, with the exception of the months of July and August, shall be held on the first and third Thursday, and there shall be one (1) meeting during July and August as scheduled in the Annual Meeting Notice. All meetings shall commence at 7:30 p.m. at the Council chambers unless another time or place is fixed by Resolution of the Mayor and Council or in the call for the meeting. When the first or third Thursday falls on a holiday, the regular meeting for that month shall be held on the Monday before or the Monday following.

Rule 2. Annual Meeting: Adoption of Rules of Order; Election of President of the Council.

At the annual <u>reorganization</u> meeting of the Council, the Council shall, by Resolution, adopt Rules of Order, and elect, by majority vote of all its members, one (1) of its members to act as President of the Council for the ensuing year. The President of the Council shall, in the absence of the Mayor from the Borough and in accordance with law, perform the duties of the Mayor. If the President of the Council is unable to perform the duties of the Acting Mayor, then the member of Council with the longest term of service may act temporarily for the President of the Council.

Rule 3. Call to Order.

The Council shall be called to order by the Mayor or, in his absence, by the President of the Council or, in the absence of both, by the member of the Council with the longest term of service.

Rule 4. Quorum.

A quorum shall consist of three (3) Councilmembers and the Mayor or, in the absence of the Mayor, four (4) Councilmembers shall constitute a quorum for transacting business.

Rule 5. Order of Business.

The regular order of business shall be as follows:

- a. Salute to the flag and a moment of silence for our service men and women serving at home and abroad.
- b. Roll call by the Clerk.
- c. Special presentations, if any.
- d. Reports of standing committees as follows:
 - 1. Administration and Finance
 - 2. Police
 - 3. Public Works/Buildings and Grounds
 - 4. Public Affairs
 - i. Open Space
 - ii. Environmental
 - iii. Recreation
 - iii¥. Historical
 - iv. Board of Health
 - 5. Fire
 - Laws/Ordinances
- e. Reports of Borough officers and special committees
- f. Public portion, Agenda items only
- g. Unfinished Business
- h. New Business, Consent Agenda, Reports, Correspondence
- i. Consent Agenda Resolutions
- Non-Consent Agenda Items
- k. Public portion, general discussion
- 1. Executive Session, if necessary
- m. Adjournment

Rule 6. Calls for Special Meetings.

The Mayor shall, when necessary or advisable, call special meetings of the Council. In case of his neglect or refusal, any four (4) members of the Council may call such meeting by notice in writing addressed and delivered to the Borough Clerk. In all cases of special meetings, the call shall state the purpose for which such special meeting shall be called, and the time, which shall be not less than three (3) days after delivery to the Borough Clerk, and the place at which it shall be held. The Clerk shall give written notice of such special meeting to each member of the Council, specifying the time, place and purpose of such special meeting, and such notice shall be addressed and

delivered to each member personally, or left at his/her residence at least two (2) days before the time fixed for such meeting, or provide same by way of e-mail. Presence of any member at such meeting without compliance with the requirements of this Rule as to notice shall constitute a waiver by such member of said requirements.

Standing Committees. Rule 7.

- The standing committees of the Council shall consist of three (3) members each, appointed by the Mayor, and the members shall serve at the discretion of the Mayor. The standing committees shall be as follows:

- Members of any committee shall rank in the order which they are named by the Mayor, and, in the absence of the Chairman, the ranking member present shall act as Chairman of the committee.

Rule 8. Nonstanding and Special Committees.

The Mayor shall appoint such other nonstanding committees or special committees, comprised of members and/or citizens as he shall deem advisable; and all members of all committees shall be appointed by the Mayor, or, in his absence, by the presiding officer for the time being. The Council may also establish a nonstanding committee or special committee by way of ordinance, with the term of membership and appointments to be set forth in said ordinance.

Rule 9. Preservation of Order and Decorum; Questions of Order.

The Mayor or presiding officer shall preserve order and decorum, and shall decide all questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council.

Rule 10. Method of Speaking.

Every member shall address the Chair while speaking.

Rule 11 Divisions of the Question.

Any member may call for a division of the questions if two (2) or more distinct propositions be therein involved, either of which may stand on its own merits.

Rule 12. Motions When a Question is Under Consideration.

When a question is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained, except to adjourn, to lay on the table the previous question, to postpone indefinitely, to postpone to a stated time, to recommit, to refer to a committee or to amend, which motions shall have precedence in the order in which they are mentioned.

Rule 13. Reconsideration of a Question.

Any member having voted with the majority on any question may move for a reconsideration thereof at the same or any regular meeting; but no motion for a reconsideration shall be taken a second time on the same question, except by unanimous consent.

Rule 14. Speaking More Than Once on the Same Question.

No member shall speak more than twice on the same question without leave of the Mayor or Council, nor more than once until every member desiring to speak shall have spoken.

Rule 15. Introduction or Withdrawal of Motions and Resolutions.

All Resolutions, if required by the Mayor or presiding officer or a member, shall be reduced to writing. Oral motions shall be permitted provided the oral motion is reduced to writing and presented to the Council for memorialization at its next regularly scheduled meeting. All motions, when seconded and stated from the Chair, shall be open for discussion. No motion or Resolution can be withdrawn after it shall have been amended or decided.

Rule 16. Amendments Restricted to Subject Under Consideration.

No matter foreign to the subject under consideration shall be received under cover of an amendment of the same.

Rule 17. Members Present Required to Vote Unless Excused.

Every member who shall be present when the question is put shall vote for or against the same. Any member who desires to abstain must, prior to any discussion on the measure, seek to be excused from the vote by a vote of the Council. If the Council excuses that member, then the member shall step down and not participate in the discussion or vote.

Rule 18. Recording of Votes.

The yeas and nays may be called for by the Mayor or presiding officer or any member, in which case the names of the members voting shall be recorded on the minutes. On every Resolution appropriating money, the Resolution may be placed on the Consent Agenda and the yeas and nays on the Consent Agenda shall be called and recorded on the minutes.

Rule 19. Calling of Members to Order.

A member called to order shall immediately comply, unless permitted to explain, and the Council, if appealed to, shall decide on the case. If there be no appeal, the decision of the Chair shall be binding.

Rule 20. Departure From Regular Order of Business; Suspension of Rules.

No departure from the regular order of business and no suspension of any Rule shall be allowed, except at the discretion of the presiding officer.

Rule 21. Substitution When Presiding Officer Leaves the Chair.

Whenever the presiding officer may wish to leave the Chair, the presiding officer shall have power to substitute a member as the presiding officer, but no such substitution shall continue beyond the meeting at which it is made.

Rule 22. Recognition of Members for Speaking.

Whenever two (2) or more members wish to be recognized, the presiding officer shall name the member who is first to speak.

Rule 23. Committee Reports.

Committees appointed to report on any subject referred to them by the Mayor or the Council shall report the facts in writing or verbally, as directed by the Mayor, in relation to the subject referred, and shall attach to said report all resolutions, petitions, remonstrances and other papers relative to the subject of the report. A minority of any committee may submit a report. The Council standing committees may report to the Mayor and Council in writing or orally, at the discretion of the Committee Chair.

Rule 24. Mayor Ex Officio Member of Committees.

The Mayor shall be ex officio a member of all committees, but a majority of the members of such committee, exclusive of the Mayor, shall be sufficient to agree upon a report.

Rule 25. Purchase Orders for Claims.

Purchase orders for claims against the Council shall be provided by and furnished to claimants on application at the office of the Chief Financial Officer, and no claims shall be received by the Council unless the same be made out on the appropriate purchase orders and verified under oath.

Rule 26. Robert's Rules of Order to Govern.

Robert's Rules of Order may provide guidance to the Council on all points not provided for herein.

Rule 27. Amendment of Rules; Breaking of Tied Votes.

These Rules shall not be altered, amended, repealed or added to except at a meeting of the Council and by a majority vote of the entire Council, except that if the entire Council shall divide evenly on the question of alteration, amendment, repeal or addition, the Mayor shall have a vote to break the tie.

Rule 28. Repeal of Previous Rules.

All and every previous Rule or Rules at any time heretofore adopted by this Council are hereby abrogated, and the Rules hereby adopted shall, until changed by subsequent action, be the only Rules of this Council.

Rule 29. Time Limit for Items for Agenda.

No communication, report, petition or matter of any nature may be considered by the Mayor and Council at its next regular meeting unless it was received by the Borough Clerk no later than <u>noon</u> (12:00 p.m.) 4:00 p.m. of the <u>Friday Tuesday</u> prior to the meeting, if it be a regular meeting date, or three (3) full days prior to any special meeting unless such matter is of an emergent nature that requires immediate Council consideration, which emergent status shall be determined by the Mayor. Nothing herein shall prohibit a member of the Council from raising a discussion item or from making a motion on the dais during a meeting.

Rule 30. Filing Minutes and Reports of Boards and Committees.

The minutes and reports of all Borough boards, committees and officers are to be incorporated in the Borough Council minutes by reference thereto and are to be filed and indexed by the Borough Clerk for future reference.

Part II. Procedures for Adoption of an Ordinance.

The adoption of all ordinances shall comply with the procedural requirements of N.J.S.A. 40:49-1, et seq., and N.J.S.A. 40A:60-1, et seq., including all additional requirements that may be applicable pursuant to New Jersey law, including, without limitation, the required

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that in the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of

the Borough of Watchung, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern, and the inconsistencies of the prior ordinance are hereby repealed. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Ordinances of the Borough of Watchung are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County of the Borough of Watchung that within five (5) days after its adoption by the Council, this Ordinance shall be presented to the Mayor for his approval and signature, which approval shall be granted or denied within ten (10) days of receipt of same, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:60-5(d). If the Mayor fails to return this Ordinance with either his approval or objection to same within ten (10) days after it has been presented to him, then this Ordinance shall be deemed approved; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that this Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law; and approval by the Mayor pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:60-5(d).

ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 12, FIRE PREVENTION, OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG

WHEREAS, the Uniform Fire Safety Act, *N.J.S.A.* 52:27D-192 et seq. and the Uniform Fire Code, *N.J.A.C.* 5:70-1 et seq. are locally enforced in the Borough of Watchung by the Fire Prevention Bureau; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 12 of the Code of the Borough of Watchung ("Code") creates and governs the Fire Prevention Bureau and provides for the registration and inspection of "life hazard uses" within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough Watchung has determined that in order to promote the health, safety, and welfare of Borough residents it is necessary to amend Chapter 12 of the Code of the Borough of Watchung to require the registration and inspection of "non-life hazard uses" and fire suppression/sprinkler systems within the Borough of Watchung.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, that it hereby amends Chapter 12 of the Code of the Borough of Watchung, entitled, "Fire Prevention" to state as follows: [New language in **bold and underlined** and deleted language in **double strikethrough**.]

CHAPTER 12

FIRE PREVENTION

§ 12-1 LOCAL ENFORCEMENT OF THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE.

§ 12-1.1 Local Enforcement Authorized.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-202(a) of the Uniform Fire Safety Act (P.L. 1983, c. 383 Section 11) the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code shall be locally enforced in the Borough of Watchung.

§ 12-1.2 Agency Designation.

The local enforcing agency shall be the Watchung Fire Department Bureau of Fire Prevention.

§ 12-1.3 Duties.

The local enforcing agency shall enforce the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the codes and regulations adopted under it in all buildings, structures, and premises within the Borough, other than owner-occupied buildings used exclusively for dwelling purposes and containing fewer than three dwelling units (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-203(a)).

§ 12-1.4 Inspection of Life Hazard Uses.

The local enforcing agency established in subsection 12-1.2 shall carry out at least once per year the periodic inspections of life hazard uses as defined in and required by the Uniform Fire Code (N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.4 through N.J.A.C. 5:70_2.4D) on behalf of the Commissioner of Community Affairs.

- § 12-1.4A Registration and inspection of non-life-hazard uses.
- a. All commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that do not fall within the definition of life hazard uses shall submit an annual registration to the Borough of Watchung <u>Bureau of Fire Prevention-Clerk</u> and shall be inspected annually by the local enforcing agency for compliance with the Uniform Fire Code.
- b. All commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that are not within the definition of life hazard uses, upon a change of use or change of occupancy shall register with the Borough of Watchung **Bureau of Fire Prevention**—Clerk and be inspected by the local enforcing agency for compliance with the Uniform Fire Code.
- c. The necessary forms shall be provided by the Borough of Watchung <u>Bureau of Fire Prevention Clerk</u> and shall require information substantially similar to that required for the registration of life hazard uses as set forth in N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.6.
- d. The annual registration and change of use/occupancy fees for non-life-hazard uses are as follows:

e. If an owner of a non-life-hazard use has not registered and paid the appropriate fee, the local enforcing agency shall notify the owner in writing of said noncompliance, including an explanation of the nature of the noncompliance. The failure to comply within thirty (30) days after receipt of said notice shall be a violation of this chapter.

§ 12-1.5 Organization; Fire Official.

The local enforcing agency established by subsection 12-1.2 shall be under the direct supervision and control of the Fire Official, who shall report to the Borough Administrator.

§ 12-1.6 Appointments, Term of Office, Removal.

- a. Appointment of Fire Official. The local enforcing agency shall be under the supervision of a Fire Official who shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. The Fire Official shall serve as the chief administrator of the agency.
- b. Term of Office. The Fire Official shall serve for a term of one year, or until a successor has been appointed.
- c. Inspectors and Employees. The Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council shall appoint such inspectors and other employees as may be necessary in the local enforcing agency.
- d. Removal from Office. Inspectors and other employees of the enforcing agency shall be subject to removal by the Mayor or the Council for inefficiency or misconduct. Each inspector or employee proposed to be removed shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard by the appointing authority or a designated hearing officer.

§ 12-1.7 Board of Appeals.

Pursuant to Sections 15 and 17 of the Uniform Fire Safety Act, any person aggrieved by any order of the local enforcing agency shall have the right to appeal to the Construction Board of Appeals of the County of Somerset upon written request for a hearing. A copy of the request shall be sent to the local enforcing agency at the time the request is made.

§ 12-2 SMOKE SENSITIVE ALARM, CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM DEVICES, AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSTALLATION.

§ 12-2.1 Requirement for Smoke-Sensitive and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Devices and Fire Extinguisher Installation in One- or Two-Family Structures.

A structure used or intended for use for residential purposes by not more than two families shall have a smoke-sensitive and carbon monoxide alarm device on each level of the structure and

outside each separate sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms and located on or near the ceiling, or as specified by manufacturer-installation recommendation. The installation of battery-operated, smoke-sensitive and carbon monoxide alarm devices shall be accepted as meeting the requirements of this section. Additionally, fire extinguishers shall be installed (mounted unobstructed from view) within 10 feet of any and all kitchen areas.

§ 12-2.2 Change of Occupancy.

Before any structure set forth in subsection 12-2.1 above is sold, leased, or otherwise made subject to a change of tenancy or occupancy for residential purposes, the owner shall obtain a certificate of smoke sensitive and carbon monoxide alarm device and fire extinguisher compliance (Certificate of Smoke Detector Compliance – hereinafter referred to as "CSDC") from the local enforcing agency. The application for a CSDC shall be provided by the local enforcing agency upon request of the applicant.

§ 12-2.3 Multiple Dwellings.

Compliance with the requirements of the Uniform Fire Safety Act relating to smokesensitive and carbon monoxide alarm devices and fire extinguishers in all multiple dwellings of more than two families shall be governed by the provisions of §27-8 of the Code of the Borough of Watchung.

§ 12-2.4 Types of Smoke-Sensitive and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Devices Required.

All devices and equipment for smoke-sensitive and carbon monoxide alarm devices shall be approved or listed by a nationally recognized testing laboratory, i.e., UL or FM, and shall be in compliance with all regulations of authorizing agencies. It shall be the obligation of the owner of such smoke-sensitive and carbon monoxide alarm devices to maintain the same in operable condition at all times. Fire extinguishers shall meet or exceed the requirements set forth in N.J.A.C. 5:70-4.19(e).

§ 12-2.5 Enforcement.

The enforcement and administration of the provisions of the smoke-sensitive alarm device provisions set forth herein are delegated to the Fire Inspector appointed in accordance with subsection 12-1.6 of this chapter. The Fire Inspector will prepare and arrange for the dissemination of appropriate forms, certificates, and other required paperwork to implement the requirements of this section. The certification of compliance with the terms of this section may be executed by the Fire Inspector once compliance has been completed.

§ 12-2.6 Fees.

The owner of the structure(s) referred to herein, which require the inspection and/or installation of smoke-sensitive, carbon monoxide alarm devices and fire extinguishers, shall be required to apply for an inspection to verify the owner's compliance with the terms of this section from the Fire Inspector, ten (10) working days prior to the date inspection is required. Provided the application is filed and the fee is paid to the Fire Inspector not less than 10 working days prior to the date of the requested inspection, the fee for the inspection shall be \$100.. If the application for the inspection is filed and/or the fee is paid nine or fewer working days prior to the date

requested by the applicant for inspection, the fee shall be \$150, or such other amount at the Fire Inspector's discretion, but not to exceed \$150 dollars. The fee for any required reinspection (which shall not be those inspections referred to in subsection 12-2.7 hereof) shall be \$25, which shall be due and payable at the time of reinspection.

§ 12-2.7 Inspector's Maximum Wait Time.

The Fire Inspector performing the inspection called for herein shall be required to wait no more than 15 minutes after the time set for the performance of the inspection. If the person requesting the inspection does not appear to let the Fire Inspector into the property to be inspected within that 15-minute period, the owner or person requesting the inspection must request that the Fire Inspector return for the inspection and shall pay an additional fee of \$25.

§ 12-2.8 Duration of Certificate of Compliance.

All certificates of compliance issued hereunder shall be valid for 60 days from the date of issuance. In the event closing of title or change of occupancy for the property for which the certificate is issued does not take place within the 60-day period, the owner of the property will be required obtain a new inspection of the same at the cost set forth in §12-2.6.

§ 12-2.9 Allocation of Inspection Fees.

All fees and revenues received pursuant to this Section 12-2 shall be appropriated by the Mayor and Borough Council to the Office of the Fire Inspector for the purpose of enforcing the Borough of Watchung's Fire Protection Code, as required by all applicable laws and ordinances.

§ 12-2A REGISTRATION OF FIRE SUPPRESSION/SPRINKLER SYSTEMS

§ 12-2A-1 Registration of Fire Suppression/Sprinkler System

- a. All commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that are not within the definition of life hazard uses and have a fire suppression and/or sprinkler system shall register annually with the Borough of Watchung **Bureau of Fire Prevention**—Clerk and shall be subject to an annual review by the local enforcing agency for compliance with all applicable laws and ordinances.
- b. All commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that are not within the definition of life hazard uses and have a fire suppression and/or sprinkler system shall register upon a change of occupancy or change of use with the Borough of Watchung **Bureau of Fire Prevention**—Clerk and shall be subject to a review by the local enforcing agency for compliance with all applicable laws and ordinances.
- c. In order to complete the registration, all commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that are not within the definition of life hazard uses and have a fire suppression and/or sprinkler system shall complete a Borough of Watchung registration form, which shall include a certificate from a registered/certified fire suppression and/or sprinkler system professional stating that the current system is in full compliance with all applicable laws and ordinances.

d. Each separate building, store, premises, place, or location shall require a separate registration, unless a single system is utilized to cover and protect separate premises or locations, and in such a case, the single registration shall indicate the same.

§ 12-2A-2 Registration Fee of Fire Suppression/Sprinkler System

The Borough of Watchung <u>Bureau of Fire Prevention-Clerk</u> shall collect a fee of \$75.00 for the registration of the fire suppression and/or sprinkler system for all commercial, industrial, educational, recreational, and other nonresidential uses that are not within the definition of life hazard uses.

§ 12-3 FIRE LANES AND FIRE ZONES.

§ 12-3.1 General Provisions.

- a. Designation of Fire Lanes and Fire Zones.
- 1. Certain areas within the Borough of Watchung shall be designated as fire lanes to provide clear access to buildings for firefighting equipment in the event of an emergency. Fire hydrants and water connection devices located on local, County, State, and private roads shall be designated as fire zones.
 - 2. Fire lanes/fire zones may be located on public or private property.
- 3. Fire lanes/fire zones shall be established by the Fire Official, and drawings or pictures of properties delineating fire lanes/fire zones shall be kept on file in the Bureau of Fire Prevention.
- b. Notice to Affected Property Owners.
- 1. Notice that a property requires the posting of signs or painting of fire lanes/fire zones shall be sent to the property owner by the Bureau of Fire Prevention, whether by personal delivery or certified mail.
- 2. Within 30 days of receipt of such notice, said property owner shall install required signs and paint required stripes.
- c. Intervention by the Borough for Failure to Comply. In the event a property owner fails to comply with the requirements of this section, the Bureau of Fire Prevention shall issue a Notice of Violation, followed by a summons returnable in the Municipal Court if the violation is not abated within 10 days of the date of the Notice of Violation.
- d. Parking, Stopping, or Standing of Vehicles Prohibited. No person shall park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, in any designated fire lane or fire zone or obstruct any designated fire lane or fire zone.
- e. Fire Hydrants. No person shall park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle within 15 feet of any fire hydrant or other fire water connection device.

- f. Restrictions for Loading Zones. In designated loading zones, attended vehicles may stop solely for the purpose of loading or unloading and only for the period of time necessary to accomplish such loading or unloading.
 - g. Installation of Signs, Painting of Lines.

1.Markings. The owner shall, within 30 days of being given notice to do so by the Fire Official, mark the lanes as follows:

Signs, with minimum dimensions of 12 inches by 18 inches constructed of metal with raised red letters a minimum of two inches in size on a white background shall be posted at a level of at least seven feet above grade, indicating "NO PARKING FIRE ZONE" or "NO PARKING FIRE LANE." Spacing of signs shall be even with a minimum of one sign for every 50 feet of fire lane or part thereof, or as ordered by the Fire Official. All signs and markings must be unobstructed and visible for a distance of at least 100 feet when viewed from a position approximately five feet above the ground while in the fire lane.

2. Diagonal yellow lines six inches in width shall be painted on the pavement along the length of the fire lane/fire zone. Fire Lanes or Fire Zones shall have a minimum width of 18 feet, a minimum depth of six feet from curb and/or edge of pavement, with lettering measuring one and one-half (1 1/2) feet stating:

FIRE ZONE

FIRE LANE

NO PARKING

NO PARKING

or all as directed by the Fire Official.

- 3. Fire zones associated with fire hydrants and water connection devices shall be identified with yellow paint extending 15 feet in both directions on the curb and/or pavement where possible.
 - 4. All curbing shall be painted yellow.

§ 12-3.2 Enforcement Agencies.

The Borough of Watchung Police Department will enforce the fire lanes/fire zone parking restrictions. The Bureau of Fire Prevention will enforce the installation of signs and painting of lines in fire lanes/fire zones.

§ 12-3.3 Penalties.

- a. Violators who park illegally in a fire lane or fire zone, obstruct fire hydrants from use, or obstruct Fire Department connections, shall be subject to a fine of \$100 Said fine shall be imposed on complaint and conviction in the Municipal Court.
- b. Property owners failing to install signs or paint pavement within 30 days of receipt of notice requiring such signs or painted pavement shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500. Said fine shall be imposed on complaint and conviction in the Municipal Court. Each day that the

property owner fails to install a sign or paint the pavement shall be considered a separate and specific violation.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to that end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies only; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that this Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of New Jersey has, in N.J.S.A. 40:48 et seq and N.J.S.A. 40:55D et seq., conferred upon local governments the authority to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has identified special flood hazard areas within the boundaries of Borough of Watchung and such areas may be subject to periodic inundation which may result in loss of life and property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base, all of which adversely affect the public health, safety and general welfare, and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung was accepted for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program on December 4, 1979 and the Borough of Watchung's Mayor and Council desires to continue to meet the requirements of Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 59, 60 (most of the requirements for a community ordinance), 65 and 70 (mapping regulations) necessary for such participation; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung is required, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:23 et seq., to administer and enforce the State building codes, and such building codes contain certain provisions that apply to the design and construction of buildings and structures in flood hazard areas; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung is required, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:49-5, to enforce zoning codes that secure safety from floods and contain certain provisions that apply to the development of lands; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Watchung is required, pursuant to N.J.S.A.58:16A-57, within 12 months after the delineation of any flood hazard area, to adopt rules and regulations concerning the development and use of land in the flood fringe area which at least conform to the standards promulgated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP); and

WHEREAS, after adoption and review by the NJDEP the Ordinance is being amended to change the designation of the Floodplain Administrator from the Director of Code Enforcement/Zoning to the Borough's Engineer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Watchung, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Ordinance No. 23/02 establishing the Borough's Floodplain Management Regulations is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 103.1 entitled "Floodplain Administrator Designation" is hereby supplemented and amended to read as follows: [New language **bold and underlined** and

deleted language in double strikethrough.]

103.1 Floodplain Administrator Designation. The Borough of Watchung, Director-of Code-Enforcement/Zoning-Borough Engineer is designated the Floodplain Administrator. The Floodplain Administrator shall have the authority to delegate performance of certain duties to other employees.

SECTION 2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 23/02 adopted on April 20, 2023 remain unchanged, and full force and effect.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.

Where any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of these regulations is, for any reason, declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the regulations as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordaince be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordaince shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to that end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; and

BE IT FURTHER CRDA INED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that in the event of any inconsistences between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Borough of Watchung, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern, and the inconsistencies of the prior ordinance are hereby repealed. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Ordinances of the Borough of Watchung are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Watchung that within five (5) days after its adoption by the Council, this Ordinance shall be presented to the Mayor for his approval and signature, which approval shall be granted or denied within ten (10) days of receipt of same, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:60-5(d). If the Mayor fails to return this Ordinance with

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG PLANNING BOARD TO UNDERTAKE A PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION FOR THE REDEVELOPMENT OF BLOCK 7010, LOTS 5.01, 5.02, AND 5.03 AS SHOWN ON THE BOROUGH OF WATCHUNG TAX MAP AS A NON-CONDEMNATION REDEVELOPMENT AREA

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 et seq. provides a mechanism to empower and assist local governments in efforts to promote programs of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law sets forth specific procedures for establishing an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-6, prior to the Borough Council making a determination as to whether a particular study area qualifies as an area in need of redevelopment, the Borough Council must authorize the Watchung Borough Planning Board, by Resolution, to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether the subject area meets the criteria of an area in need of redevelopment as set forth in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Legislature amended the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law on September 6, 2013 to expand and clarify various provisions of same; and

WHEREAS, as required by the amendment to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-6, the Legislature has directed that the Resolution authorizing the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation state whether the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the Borough to use all of those powers provided by the Legislature for use in a redevelopment area other than the use of eminent domain ("Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, the redevelopment area determination shall authorize the Borough of Watchung to use all of the powers provided by the Legislature for use in a redevelopment area other than the use of eminent domain, thus designating it a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council wishes to direct the Watchung Borough Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of the property identified as Block 7010, Lots 5.01, 5.02 and 5.03, located at 18 Drift Road (the "Study Area") to determine whether the Study Area qualifies as an area in need of redevelopment pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Watchung, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, that the Watchung Borough Planning Board is hereby directed to conduct the necessary preliminary investigation, including the holding of a public hearing, to determine whether the Study Area identified above is or is not an area in need of redevelopment under the criteria set forth in *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 et seq.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Board shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Borough Council in the form of a Resolution with supporting documentation.

- 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
- 2. The Borough is hereby authorized to enter into the Funding Agreement with Capodagli.
- 3. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to the Funding Agreement in substantially the form attached to and made a part of this Resolution.
- 4. The Borough Clerk, Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and other appropriate official are authorized to take appropriate actions to accomplish the authorizations set forth in this Resolution and the attached Funding Agreement, including the acceptance of the escrow payment, establishment of an escrow account for the work authorized herein, and distribution of same.
