REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

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- 1. Administration & Finance Councilman Fischer noted that in addition to the submitted report, our CFO has been working with the state budget examiner regarding the submission of our 2023 introduced budget. The State had a few questions and all documentation regarding shared services and grants was supplied. The CFO received the state's approval this week to move forward with the public hearing and adoption of the budget at the April 20, 2023 meeting. This was the quickest and smoothest state exam Watchung has had in a long time. At the next agenda we are going to be putting on the a few more dedications by riders like the ones we did last month, this was one of the State's recommendations.
- 2. Police Councilman Marano mentioned the Officer was hired via the Somerset County Scholarship program. He discussed installing cameras in the Watchung Lake parking area, Mobus field, and Library parking lot for added security. Discussions also occurred with the Board of Education regarding the Student Resource Officer and school security.
- 3. Public Works / Buildings and Grounds Council President Ead noted that in addition to the report submitted, there was a water main break today and noted it was a good thing that school was out on spring break. April 24th will be a day of paving and milling and notices will be sent out. Discussions also occurred relating to improvements to Mobus Field, reviewal of the grant application and the 2023 paving project.

4. Public Affairs:

Environmental – Councilwoman Abi-Habib reminded all about the upcoming Operation Pride Borough event scheduled for April 22^{nd.} at the Texier House. She mentioned the Committee will be giving away 300 tree saplings on a first come first serve basis from 1:00 to 3:00 PM and also mentioned the Commission will be by the stream on the East side of Best Lake and they are seeking volunteers.

Recreation – Councilman Dahl mentioned opening day for little league is scheduled for April 29th followed by the first annual Watchung Spring bash which is the Police Department, Fire Department, Rescue Squad, Department of Public Works and Council playing softball on Grant Field. He also highlighted the successful Easter Egg Hunt event done by Linda Monetti which had between 200-500 attendees and had over 4,000 eggs.

Historical – Councilman Fischer reminded all the hours of operation for the Texier House and mentioned the Committee is having discussions regarding the upcoming 100th anniversary of Watchung.

Board of Health – Councilman Marano mentioned the Board of Health set a date for an upcoming meeting in the month of October. Mayor Jubin inquired on ideas from the Committee for the Mayors Wellness Campaign.

5. Fire – Councilman Dahl advised the Committee is scheduled to meet this upcoming Tuesday and they are still working through a possible grant with the North Plainfield Fire Department.

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6. Laws/Ordinances – Councilman Hayeck mentioned the Committee is having discussions relating to the outdoor dinning Ordinance, Recreation services Ordinance, and lastly the Committee is working on public safety ordinances.

- 7. Engineer Borough Engineer Jason Cline reported on the storm water grant funding application the Borough is submitting for \$25,000.00. He also discussed updates relating to Ness Farm, proposals for the Library Bridge and Phillips Bridge and repairs to various culverts.
- 8. Police Chief Police Chief Hart reported on the numbers for the month of March, 48 summons issued on Hillcrest Road, 20 radar posts issuing 18 summons and 13 warnings on Valley Road, Hill Hollow Road, and Ridge Road. He also provided comments regarding the beautiful ceremony the Mayor and Council held on March 27th recognizing four amazing women and one of them being Anita Nappa from the Police Department.
- 9. Fire Chief The Fire Department submitted a written report.
- 10. Fire Official Fire Official Chris Chuba was unable to attend.
- 11. Rescue Squad The Rescue Squad provided a written report.
- 12. Emergency Management OEM Coordinator Carolyn Solon provided details regarding the two Emergency Operation Center exercises conducted.
- 13. Attorney Attorney Sordillo had no report.
- 14. Finance CFO Bill Hance submitted a written report, read earlier by Councilman Fischer.
- 15. Clerk Clerk Edith Gil reported that approximately 12 Radon kits are still available for residents. She also provided a status update on CivicPlus. She advised that Deputy Clerk Regina and her held their 3rd meeting with them this week and we are in the stages of testing out the agenda generating side of the module as well as sending them our agenda packets and minutes of the past 3 years to ensure compliance with best practices. The next call will involve the minutes module and integrating our zoom meetings to test out the timestamping feature which will allow the public to jump to specific points in time of a Council meeting.
- 16. Administrator Administrator Damato provided detailed comments on the next steps of moving forward with the library renovation proposals.
- 17. Youth Services Councilman Dahl noted there was nothing further to add to the submitted report.
- 18. Planning Board Mayor Jubin noted that the last few meetings have been canceled.
- 19. Municipal Alliance No report submitted.

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- 20. Library Advisory Committee Councilman Fischer thanked the Department of Public Works and Council President Ead for setting up the chairs and beautifying the library area.
- 21. Traffic and Beautification Council President Ead discussed the winter banners coming down and the welcome banners going up, beatifying multiple areas around the Borough, and volunteers for Operation Pride.
